
HOW MEDICAID CARES FOR PENNSYLVANIANS

Medicaid is more than a health care program. It is an investment in the health of our communities.



Pennsylvania Medicaid Enrollment: 3M

23% of Pennsylvanians enrolled in Medicaid:

- · Children
- · People with disabilities
- · Lower income adults (61% are working)
- · Older adults

Health Care At Risk

Pennsylvania Medicaid has been chronically underfunded. Federal cuts will make the program even less sustainable.

Pennsylvania hospitals receive just **71 cents** for every dollar it costs to care for Medicaid and uninsured patients.

Cuts will reduce that amount to 64 cents.

Less than half of Pennsylvania acute care hospitals are operating with sustainable margins.


Care across the Lifespan

Pennsylvania Medicaid covers:

- About **35%** of births
- More than **1/3** of children
- Nearly 2/3 of all nursing home residents

Cost-Effective Care

Medicaid is a partnership between the state and federal governments to protect health care for children, people with disabilities, older adults, and low-income families.



Medicaid per-enrollee spending has increased much less than other payors since 2008

Coming Changes

As many as **310,000** Pennsylvanians could lose coverage due to federal changes to Medicaid enrollment and eligibility.

As a result, Pennsylvania hospitals will see a **39–66%** increase in the uncompensated care they must absorb as a percentage of net patient revenue.

This makes communities less healthy and puts additional strain on access to care throughout the commonwealth.
