



Suggested Areas for Testing for Environmental Cleanliness

- Areas should be tested on discharge and after cleaning has occurred. It is preferable to check isolation rooms but if they are not available, any discharge room is OK.
- Testing usually consists of ATP or fluorescent dye. Cut offs for "clean" is per your equipment manufacturer's suggested values.
- Values entered into the portal are number of items that were tested (denominator) and number of items that tested "clean" (numerator)
