

Supplemental Medicaid Payments Vital and Lifesaving Care

Pennsylvania hospitals care for everyone who comes through their doors, **regardless of ability to pay.**

Medicaid supplemental payments pay directly for vital and lifesaving care. They are fundamental to the commonwealth's important partnership with the hospital community to safeguard public health and they bring substantial federal matching funds into the state.

Obstetric and Neonatal Units

deliver services for pregnant and postpartum patients, support childbirth, and provide intensive care for the most vulnerable infants. More than 12% of Pennsylvania women—and more than 47% in rural counties—live more than 30 minutes from a birthing hospital.

Critical Access Hospitals

have skilled medical teams ready to provide lifesaving care 24/7/365. They maintain the expertise and equipment to save patients from the most severe injuries, like car crashes and gunshot wounds.
